<p>Reading ideas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What stories do you know that have animals as a main character? e.g. The Highway Rat, Peter Rabbit, War Horse, The Hungry Caterpillar. Have you got any stories like this you can read? • List animal characters from as many books as you can! 	<p>Writing ideas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make up a story where an animal plays a main part • Write a description of your favourite animal <p>Spelling ideas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn your year group's words (use SpellingFrame.com website)
<p>Music:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Listen to 'Peter and the Wolf' and all the different instruments that are used to represent the different animals in the story: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9ueGfjBKbiE • Can you think of any poems/songs that have an animal in them? Learn/sing along! 	<p>Art/DT:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make a model (Lego or junk modelling) or draw a sketch of your favourite animal. Maybe you could 'zoom in' on an interesting feature eg. their eye or feathers? • Can you make a 'mask' of an animal using and decorating a paper plate?

(Mammal/fish/insect/bird/invertebrate)
